## Final Report and Recommendations for the Conference "Law and Media: Horizons and Challenges"

## Monday 27<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> of January 2020

## Ibn Khaldoun Hall, Qatar University

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This report summarizes the findings and discussions held at the Forum of "Law and Media: Horizons and Challenges," which was organized by the College of Law at Qatar University, on the 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> of January 2020.

The conference witnessed a variety of interventions. It discussed all the issues and problems related to the existing relationship between law and media. The successful discussions enriched the scientific material that could constitute a crucial jurisprudential reference.

The following are the most important recommendations of the conference:

- 1. Examine the need for special criminal legislation; to counter disinformation.
- 2. Recommend the legislator to dedicate the same approach it adopted in supporting media freedom in the new media law change-project.
- 3. Recommending an amendment to the Qatari Consumer Protection Law No. 8 of 2008; by adding a text stating that the advertiser even if he is a legal person is primarily liable for the crime of false advertisement.
- 4. Recommending the issuance of an integrated law, which would be an alternative to Law No. 1 of 2012, to regulate and monitor the placement of advertisements, and regulate all the substantive aspects of advertisements in the State of Qatar.
- 5. To consider the French experience and study the extent of its application in Qatar; with regard to the financial fine that the advertiser must pay for the harmful act, in case there is no contract between them and the consumer.
- 6. Examine the possibility of stipulating that the advertiser and the advertising agency's liability could be based on a presumed fault.
- 7. To take advantage of recent legislative experiences in the field of copyright through digital media platforms, such as European Directive No. 790 of 2019 on copyright and related rights.
- 8. The need to create specialized bodies to combat electronic copyright infringement on the Internet; in a way that does not violate basic rights and freedoms.
- 9. Examine the need of establishing a judicial body to be in charge of media and journalism issues.
- 10. To study and discuss crimes related to the field of journalism and media within relevant school subjects.
- 11. Emphasize the importance of Arab, regional and international cooperation in the fight against crimes of modern, borderless means of communication. As well as strengthening cooperation within investigation and evidence-gathering stages to tackle this criminal phenomenon.
