# Organizing a Research Event Titled "Sustainability of Urban Life in Qatar

#### The Social and Economic Survey Research Institute at Qatar University organized a research event titled "Sustainability of Urban Life in Qatar and the Gulf Region: Workshop on Measures and Methodologies," sponsored and funded by the Qatar

National Research Fund (QNRF). Brian Mandikiana, Senior Research Data Analyst at SESRI, presented a paper titled "Causal effects of happiness: The role of macroeconomic and institutional factors". The study examines the effect of macroeconomic and institutional factors on an indicator of happiness. The study uses Dynamic Panel Data System GMM and considers the effect of the six World Governance Indicators separately, as well as key macroeconomic indicators. The study finds evidence suggesting that on average, inflation and an increase in the contribution of rents to the gross domestic product

It seeks to build a cooperative alliance of experts from Qatar, the Gulf countries, and international institutions to further engage in an agenda for improving methods and metrics for continuous assessment of urban quality of life, as well as enhancing and strengthening the research capabilities of young researchers in Qatar, integrating them into a range of qualitative studies.
